Admissions

1. Erasmus coordinators log into the online registration system (ESRS) and nominate their students. Credentials are provided by the Erasmus+ Office.
2. Students receive an automated e-mail with step-by-step instructions on the application procedure and the link to their personal ESRS account used to upload required documents.
3. Once the documentation is complete, a Letter of Acceptance is issued and sent via e-mail to the student (the original may be sent via post, available upon request). Further steps are explained.

Language requirements

The required document is the **Online Linguistic Support (OLS) Language Certificate**.

The OLS must certify at least the minimum language level agreed on in the interinstitutional agreement signed by the home & host university.

Accommodation

The University of Gdansk offers limited number of residence rooms in our dormitories. Upon completing the application procedure, all eligible Erasmus incoming students will receive detailed e-mail instructions on how to apply online for student housing. The application system works on a **first-come, first-served basis**, which means not every student might be provided with a dormitory place. Housing allocation is announced approximately one month before date of arrival. Cost of the accommodation is around 460 - 620 PLN (€ 100 - 140) per month, depending on the dormitory.

Health Insurance

EU students are required to obtain a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) issued in their home country, valid for the whole period of their stay at the UG.

Non-EU students are required to obtain commercial health insurance valid for the whole period of their stay at the UG; it must provide coverage for medical expenses, treatment and assistance in transportation that might be required in emergencies.

Please note that proof of health insurance will be verified upon arrival. Failing to present such will result in rejection from the Erasmus+ programme at the University of Gdansk.

Residence Permit

EU citizens don't need a visa to study in Poland. They are allowed to stay without official permission for up to 3 months.

EU students willing to stay longer must obtain a certificate of temporary residence for an EU citizen from URZĄD WOJEWÓDZKI in Gdansk.

Non-EU/EEA citizens may enter Poland with a valid travel document (passport) and a visa (if required/subject to the country of origin). Visas can be obtained from the Polish consulate in the student's country of residence.

Students are obligated to apply for a visa for the whole period of their stay in Poland.

Detailed instructions on filing for a residence permit are given during the Orientation Days organised by the Erasmus+ Office.
